#### Note

If you modify your system after installing the update with the product DVD, you will have to perform the update again.

#### Windows 7 and Windows Server 2008 R2: Invalid certificate validation

The new certificates used for signing may possibly not be validated on the Windows 7 and Windows Server 2008 R2 operating systems.

If you do not have the possibility to update the certificate store online, the signature of the product files is displayed as invalid. In this case, update the root certificates provided by Microsoft on the offline systems. To do so, follow the instructions in FAQ 109748887 (<a href="https://support.industry.siemens.com/cs/ww/en/view/109748887">https://support.industry.siemens.com/cs/ww/en/view/109748887</a>).

#### Note for installation under Windows 7

The TIA Portal can only be run on Windows systems that support the secure hash algorithm "SHA-2". "SHA-2" is only supported under Windows 7 once a security update has been installed (KB 3033929). Therefore, make sure that the latest Windows security updates are installed on your system.

Improvements in STEP 7

## 2.1 Improvements in Update 5

## Working with the TIA Portal

Stability when working with the TIA Portal has been improved, partly based on the feedback from returned crash reports.

## **ProDiag function blocks**

ProDiag function blocks cannot be used in the block interface.

## S7-1200 CPU is not reachable in "commissioning mode"

Asynchronous commissioning is only possible to a limited extent with CPUs from the S7-1200 family, as the S7-1200 CPUs cannot maintain online connections to multiple instances of TIA Portal at the same time. As soon as you establish an active online connection to your CPU while working in asynchronous commissioning, an attempt is made to open a second TIA Portal instance for it, which is not possible for the S7-1200 CPUs.

The procedure is aborted with an error message.

This results in the following rule:

As long as you are not connected online with your S7-1200 CPU in TIA Portal, you can work with asynchronous commissioning. In this case, only one instance of asynchronous commissioning is connected online to the S7-1200 CPU in TIA Portal.

## Security note on know-how-protected blocks and projects

When protecting blocks and projects, note that full password protection is not provided until you log the project.

Optimization of project data during logging removes older, potentially unprotected project content.

## 2.2 Improvements in Update 4

## Serialize and Deserialize V2.1

The optimized versions of the Serialize and Deserialize V2.1 instructions require more work memory than their predecessor versions due to the complexity of the processed data.

## Opening data blocks

When opening data blocks, it is tested whether a block contains inconsistent snapshots of actual values. These will be deleted and you will be informed with a message. Running the program in the CPU is not influenced by this.

## SCL: Implicit data type conversion

When the SCL block was called, the data type of the in/out parameter (InOut) was not implicitly converted to the target data type. This behavior has been corrected. If you use SCL blocks in your program and transfer in-out parameters, check that the program is running correctly after upgrading.

#### Transfer of an ARRAY to the VARIANT data type

In rare cases, an ARRAY that was part of a structure and whose access path had a dereferencing, returned an incorrect length when it was transferred to a VARIANT. This behavior was corrected in V15.0.1.

#### Example

#ArrayLength := "myFC"(myVARIANT := #ref to mySTRUCT^.myARRAY);

//"myFC" calculates the length of the array that is transferred at the "myVariant" input.

## 2.3 Improvements in Update 3

## Serialize (S7-1500)

In Update 3, it is once again possible to link, to the parameter "DEST\_ARRAY", an operand whose access path contains an ARRAY with a variable index.

#### **Example:**

DEST\_ARRAY => "myDB".buffersArray[#fieldNo].receiveBuffer

## ARRAY access error (\$7-1200/\$7-1500)

In rare cases, no check was performed for ARRAY access errors if the access was performed in a loop. This behavior has been corrected. In case of ARRAY access errors, the CPU goes to STOP or performs a programmed error handling operation.

## FBD: CMP== (equal) and CMP<> (unequal) with data type VARIANT (S7-1200/S7-1500)

It is no longer permissible in the FBD to negate the output of the instructions "CMP==" and "CMP<>" with the function "Invert result of logic operation" when "VARIANT" is selected as data type. If you have used one of the two instructions with the data type "VARIANT" and a negated output, an error is signaled during compilation. Use the function "Compile software completely" to locate all uses in your program.

To remedy the error, use the instruction "CMP<>" instead of "CMP==" and vice versa. Remove the negation of the output.

### **Connecting to Teamcenter**

The Client System with TC Client Communication System (TCCS) from Teamcenter 13.0 is unable to connect the TIA Portal with Teamcenter with the following error message:

• The version of Teamcenter Rich Access Client (RAC) or Teamcenter Client Communication System (TCCS) installed on your computer is older than the server version.

Solution: An alternative is to work with Rich Application Client (RAC) from Teamcenter 13.0.

The update for the Teamcenter Client Communication System (TCCS) is available in Teamcenter 13.1 or higher.

## SCL: Derived data types in arithmetic expressions

The rules for derived data types have been standardized. It is now no longer permitted to use these data types in arithmetic expressions in SCL.

#### **Example:**

The following expression is no longer permissible in V16 Update 2:

```
#myInt := #myHW IO + 5;
```

In such cases, use a temporary tag of the basic data type:

```
#myTempUInt := #myHW IO;
```

#myINt := #myTempUInt + 5;

Alternatively, you can also convert the operand explicitly to the basic data type:

#myInt := UINT TO INT(#myHW IO) + 5;

## FBD: CMP== (equal) and CMP<> (unequal) with data type VARIANT (S7-1200/S7-1500)

It is no longer permissible in the FBD to negate the output of the instructions "CMP==" and "CMP<>" with the function "Invert result of logic operation" when "VARIANT" is selected as data type. If you have used one of the two instructions with the data type "VARIANT" and a negated output, an error is signaled during compilation. Use the function "Compile software completely" to locate all uses in your program.

To remedy the error, use the instruction "CMP<>" instead of "CMP==" and vice versa. Remove the negation of the output.

### Software units: Monitoring operands with ProDiag (S7-1500)

In the ProDiag overview window of a software unit, you are not permitted to define monitorings for tags that were declared in another software unit. In Update 1, a more precise syntax check is used to check for conformity with this rule. If you have created monitorings of tags in another software unit in your program, a compilation error message is now always generated.

## Note for users of the patch for telecontrol configurations for DNP3 and IEC

Before Version V16.0.0.1 (or higher version of V16) can be installed, the patched DLL must be replaced with the original DLL of V16.0.0.0 again.

This correction is also included in Update 1 (and higher).

## Description of the OPC UA server of S7-1200 CPUs in the information system of TIA Portal V16

The description of the OPC UA server of S7-1200 CPUs references properties of the S7-1500 OPC UA server that do not apply to S7-1200 CPUs. Example: Behavior of the OPC UA server when downloading.

An updated description of the OPC UA server of S7-1200 CPUs can be found in FAQ 109775168 (https://support.industry.siemens.com/cs/ww/en/view/109775168).

## **DB ANY TO VARIANT (\$7-1200/\$7-1500)**

Starting with V16 Update 1, error code 8155 is always output when an unknown DB is transferred. Output parameter RET\_VAL is always set to zero in this case.

Up to now, the instruction only returned error code 8155 when an unknown PLC data type or an unknown ARRAY DB was transferred as an input parameter. In the case of an unknown ARRAY DB whose data blocks are based on a PLC data type (UDT), the error response was undefined.

In order to eliminate error 8155, elsewhere in the program a symbolic use of the ARRAY DB must be interconnected as an actual parameter with a formal parameter of data type VARIANT. To work correctly, it is sufficient if the point of use is downloaded. It is not necessary to execute it.

## SCL: Arithmetic expressions and bit logic operations

In V16, the data type of an arithmetic expression did not follow the rules described in the documentation if the expression used both typed operands and untyped constants. In this case, the typed operand determined the data type of the expression, even if the untyped constant had the larger data width.

#### 2.5 Improvements in Update 1

Starting with V16 Update 1, the following rules apply equally to all calculations with tags and constants:

- The operand with the longer data type determines the data type of the expression.
- If at least one of the data types is signed, signs are used for the calculation.

### **Example:**

SINT + UINT = INT

A data type of the SINT has a length of 8 bits and contains signs. The data type UINT has a length of 16 bits and has no sign. In this case the data type of the expression is INT with a length of 16 bits and has a sign.

## Editing function block types in the ProDiag overview editor

In TIA Portal V16, function block types can be changed in the ProDiag overview editor despite being "released". If you then create a test version of the type and release it, the changes will, however, be applied to the correct version.

## 3.1 Important notes

## Character sets after Windows 10 update

Since Windows 10 Update Version 1809, Windows allows the installation of character sets either with administrator rights for each user (command "Install for all users" in the shortcut menu) or for specific users. In order to use WinCC character sets without restrictions and load them onto an HMI device, the character sets must always be installed with administrator rights.

Note that the "Install" button in the view of a character set only initiates a user-specific installation.

## Projects in Runtime after Windows 10 update

You have installed Windows 10 version 1709 on a PC with WinCC Professional and a PC with WinCC Runtime Professional. You have performed a Windows 10 update to version 1803 or version 1809 on the Runtime PC. After the Windows 10 update, it might no longer be possible in Runtime under certain circumstances to:

- Compile a project without errors in the engineering system.
- Open a project loaded by the engineering system PC in Runtime.

Solution: Set the start type of the service for the WinCC SQL instance manually to "Automatic (Delayed Start)" and restart the system.

#### Changing the installation directory

If you had installed the simulation with an earlier version of WinCC, you can no longer change the installation directory during installation.

## Logging alarms

If you use PLC tags as trigger tags for alarms, alarms are only logged if they still exist beyond the measurement cycle. If an alarm comes and goes within a measurement cycle, it is not logged.

## Access to array variables via OPC UA

If you use WinCC Runtime Advanced as OPC UA server, reading array tags is only supported when the "OPC UA Server Array index range access" setting is activated.

Writing array variables is only possible if the OPC UA client supports the "Write array elements without IndexRange" setting.

## Communication with HTTPS servers on Windows CE-based devices

On Windows CE-based devices, such as Comfort Panel, Comfort Panel PRO or Mobile Panel, communication with a HTTPS server via the Msxml2.XMLHTTP component sometimes failed due to unsupported protocol properties. The new SimaticHMI.HttpClient component of the httpocx.dll can be used as a substitute for the Msxml2.XMLHTTP. You can find a technical description of communication via SimaticHMI.HttpClient on the installation data storage medium "SIMATIC\_WinCC\_Panel\_Images\_V16" under "SIEMENS\Automation\Portal V16\...."

#### **Configuring Telnet for remote control**

You activate the Telnet service in the "WinCC Internet Settings" dialog, "Telnet" tab.

After installing this update, the tab contains the additional area "Authentication".

#### 3.9 Panel



All changes in the "Telnet" tab take effect immediately after clicking "OK"; it is not necessary to restart the HMI device.

#### **Activating Telnet authentication**

Activate the Telnet authentication as follows:

- 1. Select the "Authentication enabled" check box.
- 2. Enter a logon and password.
- 3. Save your settings with "OK".

#### Changing the logon and password

- 1. Change the logon and password.
- 2. Save your settings with "OK".

The new logon and password are active; the previous logon and password have been deleted.

#### **Deactivating Telnet authentication**

When you deactivate Telnet authentication, the logon and password are locked. After reactivating the Telnet authentication, logon and password are unlocked again.

## **Deactivating the Telnet service**

When you deactivate the Telnet service, the settings under "Authentication" are blocked. After reactivating the Telnet service, the previous settings under "Authentication" are unlocked again.

## 4.1 Important notes (WinCC Unified)

Information that could not be included in the documentation and important information about product properties.

## **Uninstalling WinCC**

If you have already installed an update for WinCC Unified V16 and want to uninstall WinCC V16, proceed as follows:

- Open the Control Panel.
- Start the uninstallation of SIMATIC WinCC Unified PC V16.0 UPDx.
- When selecting the components, select "SIMATIC WinCC Update 16.0 UPDx" for uninstallation.
- After completing this uninstallation, uninstall all desired components of WinCC V16 via the installation medium.

## Screen objects

#### Symbolic IO field

Text lists that are used on a symbolic I/O field may not contain texts exceeding 128 characters.

### Graphic objects in Runtime

High-resolution graphic objects require a lot of memory in the project and cause long loading times. They also reduce performance in Runtime.

Use graphic objects with a resolution that is sufficient for a high-quality display in the Runtime project. Note the display resolution of the target device and the size in which the graphic object is displayed on the display of the target device. Adapt the resolution of large graphics objects accordingly before using them in your project.

#### **SVG** graphics

The SVG graphics support the SVG 1.2 Tiny standard. Note the following restrictions when using SVG graphics:

- The CSS definitions are converted to inline attributes.
- Embedded scripts and non-local URLs are not supported in the SVG graphics and are removed from the original graphics during conversion when imported into TIA Portal.
- The use of SVG graphics with embedded animations is not supported.
- The use of large SVG graphics affects performance due to the load associated with the increased characters.

#### 4.1 Important notes (WinCC Unified)

- Migration of SVG graphics from WinCC V7 to the TIA Portal is not supported.
- The following SVG characteristics are not supported:
  - Scripting
  - Interactivity
  - Styling
  - Expandability no ForeignObjects
  - Animations

If screen objects have the value "None" for the "Scale background graphic" property, set the following SVG attributes to display SVG graphics:

- Width: Pixel or percent
- · Height: Pixel or percent

It is recommended to specify the value in pixels. If the width and height are not set, the pixel values entered in the SVG attribute "viewbox" are used. This does not apply to Firefox.

Screen objects using an SVG graphic that was scaled in the engineering system as background graphic are not displayed correctly in Chrome in Runtime.

#### Touch area

The "Touch area" object distinguishes between the following gestures:

- Right
- Links
- Forward
- Backward

You need to program a J-script to differentiate the gestures.

- 1. Click in the Inspector window under "Properties > Events > Gesture detected".
- 2. Copy the code example into the programming window.

#### Code example

#### **Faceplates**

PLC user data types of a 1505SP PLC cannot be used in the tag interface of a faceplate.

## Tags - "smoothing" mode (Unified Comfort Panel)

The following applies to logging tags and control tags: If the value "No smoothing" is set in the tag properties under "Smoothing > Mode", the values are still smoothed.

#### **Example:**

A logging tag changes its value as follows: "100" > "101" > "101".

Even if "No smoothing" is set in the properties of the tag, the values [100, 101] are still stored in the logging database.

4.1 Important notes (WinCC Unified)

#### Alarms and alarm view

#### Controller alarms

If the connection between HMI device and controller is interrupted, only the last occurring controller message can be sent and displayed after restarting the runtime software. When the connection is re-established, all controller messages are transmitted correctly again.

#### Parameter sets and parameter set display

#### Using parameter set display from V16 project

If you have configured a parameter set display in WinCC V16, open this project with an update for WinCC V16 and load it to the HMI device, the numbers of the parameter sets are not displayed on the HMI device. Proceed as follows to continue using this parameter set display:

- 1. Create a new project in a new instance of WinCC V16 with installed update.
- 2. Insert a Unified Comfort Panel or a SIMATIC Unified PC into the project.
- 3. Copy the devices from the original project into the new project.

#### Data type for user data type elements of parameter set types

The "Time\_Of\_Day" data type is not permitted for the user data type elements of a parameter set type.

#### Data type for control tags of parameter set types

If you use control tags for a parameter set type, the control tags must have a "signed" data type.

#### Special characters in the parameter set display

The special character 'is not allowed in the value of a parameter set.

#### Visibility of columns in the parameter set display

Changing the visibility of columns in a parameter set display is not supported. Do not change the default value for the following parameter view property:

"Miscellaneous > Parameter view > Columns > [x] Advanced parameter control view column > Advanced parameter control view blocks".

### Data type for dynamization tag of a parameter set type

In a parameter set display, you can specify a dynamization tag under "Properties > General > Fixed parameter set type". If you use a dynamization tag, this tag must have the data type "String" or "WString".

#### Configuring a storage medium for parameter sets

Select the same storage medium that you have configured for tag persistence or alarm logging under "Properties > Information" for parameter set types. If you specify different storage media, the "EjectStorageMedium" system function is not available.

#### Importing parameter sets

When you import parameter sets, ensure that the following requirements are met:

- There is no other parameter set with the same display name in any of the configured languages.
- The numerical values in the import file are within the permitted value range of the corresponding configured data type.

## System functions and scripting

## "OpenFileBrowser" system function

The "OpenFileBrowser" system function described in the help cannot be configured in V16.

#### JavaScript arguments of certain object events

The following applies to the rectangle, pointer instrument, button and circle objects: If you configure a JavaScript to an event, only the "Item" argument is passed correctly to the script. You can process the event in the script, but not the other arguments.

#### Tag.Write

The Tag.Write method works asynchronously. The Tag.Read method may return unexpected results if the processing of a preceding Write call is not yet complete.

#### Character sets

Character sets that have a dot in their name cannot be used in WinCC.

#### User administration

If no role is assigned to a user, or no function right is assigned to a role, this user or role is not loaded onto the device.

#### **Simulation**

#### Password for simulation

If you have assigned a password for the encrypted transmission on a PC via the setup routine or via the "WinCC Unified Configuration" tool and want to start the simulation on this PC, the same password must be set in the Runtime settings of the device.

## Simulation with Windows 10 Professional Update Version 1903

If you install the Runtime software on an initial installation of Windows 10 Professional Update Version 1903, the simulation does not work. Solution: Open the "SIMATIC Runtime Manager" and click the "Refresh" button.

#### **Unified Comfort Panel**

A fixed IP address must be specified when downloading via Ethernet.

#### 4.1 Important notes (WinCC Unified)

#### **OPC UA**

A Unified Comfort Panel cannot be operated as an OPC UA client.

#### Scheduler - "StartProgram"

Calling up a program via the "StartProgram" system function in the Scheduler is not supported by Unified Comfort Panel. Instead, use a "Tag" trigger in the Scheduler to initiate the system function.

#### Communication with controllers

The following controllers or communication drivers are supported by the HMI devices:

- SIMATIC S7-1500
- SIMATIC S7-1200
- SIMATIC S7-300/400

Communication with controllers of type S7-200, LOGO! and SIMOTION as well as the SIMATIC HTTP protocol are not supported at this time.

## **Project languages in Runtime**

If the language "German" is configured, the Runtime project is always started in German, independent of the defined language sequence.

To start the project in another language, use the "HMIRuntime.Language" system function.

Proceed as follows to start a project once automatically in English:

- 1. Create a "Bool" type tag, e.g. "doOnlyAtStartup".
- 2. For the project's startup screen, link the "Loaded" event with the following script:

If a text was configured for the first element in the status bar and an image for the second element, the image may not be displayed immediately after loading. In this case, perform a screen change.

Multiple selection of filter criteria is not supported in the filter dialog of the alarm view.

### Dynamizing visibility of columns

Dynamization of the visibility of columns via a script or a system function is not supported.
